Enrollment policy as per the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program Rules and Guidelines

- Each young person wishing to be part of a 4-H Club will be required to pay a participation fee before being granted membership status. Participation fees are set at \$20 per member for each member for those enrolling between September 1, 2016 to October 31, 2016. Beginning on November 1, 2016 for the continuation of the 4-H year, the participation fee will be \$25

## **Lamb, Goat and Swine Tag Validation Orders**

If you plan to exhibit any of the following species at a major show (Fort Worth, San Antonio, San Angelo or Houston) you will need to purchase a State Validation Tag. The cost of the tags is \$10 each.

**Lamb & Goat Tag orders are Due August 18th**      **Swine Tag orders are due September 15<sup>th</sup>**

If you only plan to show at the County Livestock Show you do not need to order a tag. We will use a county tag. All county and major lambs, goats and heifers will need to be purchased and validated by October 31<sup>st</sup>. All swine projects will need to be purchased by November 30<sup>th</sup>. Scheduled validation times will be announced at a later date.

All 4-H members will be recognized with a year pin & project participation certificate when they attend the Donley County 4-H Banquet. In addition, eligible 4-H members can apply for the Gold (seniors), Silver (intermediates) or Bronze (juniors) Star Awards. These awards are open to anyone wishing to apply, but members who completed a record book will take precedence over others. 4-H members will also be eligible for the I Dare You Award (13 years or older), Rookie Male & Female of the Year, and Outstanding Young 4-H Member Award (10-13 years of age). Applications for these awards are available in the office and must be completed and returned to the office by September 2<sup>nd</sup>. **The Banquet date will be in September Newsletter.** This event recognizes each 4-H member for their participation along with adult leaders and volunteers for their support and involvement with 4-H. # **Get your Texas Hunter Education Certificate in 3 steps.**

## **1. Study the Online Course Material by going to [www.hunter-ed.com/texas/](http://www.hunter-ed.com/texas/)**

Study the free online course material to provide you with the knowledge and skills you need to learn to be a safe and responsible hunter in Texas. You'll pay a \$24.50 course fee after successfully completing the course.

For hunters ages 17 and up, there is an additional \$5.00 charge for the Hunter Education Certificate, collected on behalf of Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Important: You must be at least 9 years old to take the online course.

## **2. Complete Age-Dependent Certification Requirements**

**If you are 17 years of age or older**, once you've completed all the units in the course, you'll take the Hunter Education Certification Exam. Passing the Hunter Education Certification Exam will complete your Texas Parks and Wildlife Department hunter education requirement.

**If you are 9 to 16 years of age**, to complete the Texas hunter education requirements, you must pass both the online and Field Day portions of the hunter education course.

## **3. Receive Your Texas Hunter Education Certificate**

**If you are 17 years of age or older**, after passing the final exam, you'll immediately print out your Temporary Hunter Education Certificate (valid for 90 days). Your permanent Hunter Education Certificate will be mailed to you in 3–4 weeks by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

**If you are 9 to 16 years of age**, after passing the unit quizzes, you'll immediately print out your Field Day Voucher. After successful completion of the required Field Day, which includes safe firearm techniques and participation in a live-fire exercise, you will receive a "Temporary Student Card" issued by the instructor. Your permanent Hunter Education Certificate will be mailed to you in 3–4 weeks by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.
