Exhibitors & parents who plan to exhibit steer projects at the county or major shows in 2014-15 must be present with steers to be validated on this date. The cost of validation tags will be <u>\$12.00 per head</u>. If there is a schedule conflict with this date you must contact Leonard Haynes <u>prior</u> to the date and make arrangements.

No steers will be validated after June 30th, 2014 and will not be eligible to participate in any show!!
