Donley County 4H is starting an Archery Shooting Sports Program for our youth. The Archery Shooting Sports Program is one of the fastest growing programs in the state. Donley County has just certified a new archery coach, Kirk Watson and junior coach, Joseph Watson. After our initial announcement, we have had over 20 students step forward that are interested in the program. With archery, the number of youth participating is growing each month. This affords 4H the opportunity to positively influence our next generation. 4H's motto is: "To Make the Best Better." In 4H we focus our efforts toward guiding youth in life through our Pledge: I pledge: My Head to clearer thinking, My Heart to greater loyalty, My Hands to larger service, and My Health to better living, For my club, my community, my country, and my world. ... <u>District 1 Traveling Trophy Horse Judging Contest</u> was held Friday, April 1 at WTAMU Equine Center in Canyon. Donley 4-H took three Junior Division Teams and two Senior Division Individuals along with their coach, Robin Ellis. Junior Division Team Placings: Donley Team 1 placed 3rd overall and members of that team are Malerie Simpson, Darcie Hunsaker, Calder Havens and Tanner Burch. Donley 3 placed 5th overall and members of that team are Laney Gates, Josh Dunn, Jayde Gribble and Bryce Williams. Donley 2 placed 12th and members are Hadleigh Halsell, Mycah Woodard and Brenna Ellis. Individual results: M. Simpson 4th, Gates 11th, Dunn 15th, Hunsaker 16th, Halsell 20th, Gribble 20th, Havens 25th, Burch 37th, Woodard 41st, Williams 50th and Ellis 51st

Competing in the Senior Division were Alysse Simpson and Brandalyn Ellis. Brandalyn was 2nd High Individual and Alysse placed 6th.

<u>Clarendon College Invitational Judging Contest</u> was held Saturday, April 2. Junior Division Horse Judging Team placings: Donley Team 1 placed 5th overall and members are Tanner Burch, Darcie Hunsaker, Calder Havens and Malerie Simpson. Donley Team 2 placed 7th and members were Josh Dunn, Bryce Williams and Mycah Woodard. Individual results: Burch 8th, Hunsaker 9th, Woodard 16th, Havens and Dunn 19th, M. Simpson 23rd and Williams 27th. In the Senior Division, the team of Brandalyn Ellis and Alysse Simpson placed 2nd overall and as individuals, Ellis 5th and A. Simpson 7th. Junior Division Livestock Judging Team placings: Donley Team 1 placed 10th and members are Jodee Pigg, Brock Hatley, Koyt Tucek and Clay Ward. Donley Team 2 placed 14th and members are Levi Gates, Grant Haynes, Taylee Ehlert and Maloree Wann. Donley 4-H members competed in the District Horse Judging Contest at WT on April 15th. They did well and our Senior Division girls, Brandalyn Ellis and Alysse Simpson get to advance on to State Roundup! Brandalyn was the top ranked individual and Alysse placed 3rd. In the overall team placings, the Intermediate team of Hadleigh Halsell, Mycah Woodard and Brenna Ellis placed 4th while Darcie Hunsaker, Tanner Burch, Calder Havens and Malerie Simpson placed 5th as a team. D1 SPRING ROUNDUP

Several contests were held during the District 1 Spring Roundup and we had 23 members compete in 4 different events. They all had lots of fun and represented our club well!

Livestock Judging Results

The District 1 4-H Livestock Judging Contest was held during the Spring Roundup on April 22nd at WTAMU Nance Ranch and Donley County 4-H had 15 members compete. The results for the Junior Division follow: Sheep & Goat Class- Taylee Ehlert 3rd Individual and the team of Levi Gates, Grant Haynes and Taylee Ehlert placed 4th. In the Swine Class the team of Grant, Levi and Taylee placed 2nd and as individuals Taylee 4th and Levi 9th. In the Beef Class the team of Maloree Wann, Kennady Waldrop and Hailey Wilson tied for 4th with the other Donley team of Taylee, Levi and Grant. As individuals, Grant was 4th and Kennady was 5th. Overall, Taylee Ehlert was the highest scoring Individual placing 1st and Grant placed 10th. The team of Taylee, Grant and Levi placed 2nd Overall in the contest. In the Intermediate Division, Calder Havens placed 2nd in the Beef Class with Brock Hatley placing 9th and the team of Madison Smith, Grayson Waldrop, Jodee Pigg and Brock Hatley placing 4th. In Reasons, Grayson Waldrop placed 8th and Clay Ward placed 10th. Overall, Calder Havens placed 5th. Koyt Tucek also competed in this division. Competing in the Senior Division were Ryan Ward and Caton Grahn.

Dudz to Dazzle

Donley County 4-H had 7 members compete in the Dudz to Dazzle Contest in which teams were given a discarded garment or textile item to redesign and repurpose into a new consumer product with a "closet" of additional materials that could be incorporated into their item. After completion, each team then presented their finished item to the panel of judges with each member having a speaking part in their presentation. The team of Laney Gates, Kennadie Cummins, Maloree Wann and Makenna Shadle placed 1st with their pillow made from a white shirt and the 3rd place team was Mycah Woodard, Jayde Gribble and Tandie Cummins with their scarf also made from a white shirt.

Consumer Decision Making

Four members of Donley 4-H competed in the Consumer Decision Making Contest after completing the Consumer Education Project led by Lindy Craft. This project taught members how to compare prices, test for quality and make purchases based on facts and research that will help them improve their money management and decision making skills. Our team placed 4th in the contest and members were Izzy Craft, Laney Gates, Hailey Wilson and Jayde Gribble.

Jayde Gribble and Laney Gates both competed in the District Fashion Show and both placed 3rd in their categories. Jayde competed with her handmade skirt that she modeled and Laney went down the runway wearing the swimsuit and cover-up that she stitched.
