


#### **4-H Club Officer Nominations**

#### 4-H Judgers have been busy!

<u>District 1 Traveling Trophy Horse Judging Contest</u> was held Friday, March 31<sup>st</sup> at WTAMU Equine Center in Canyon. Donley 4-H took three Junior Division Teams and one Senior Division Team along with their coach, Robin Ellis. Junior Division Team Placings with Individual rankings in (): Donley Team 3 placed 6<sup>th</sup> overall and members of that team are Bryce Williams (15), Maloree Simpson (25), Gracie Ellis (26) and Whitney Williams (42). Donley 2 placed 8<sup>th</sup> overall and members of that team are Laney Gates (21), Brenna Ellis (14) and Jayde Gribble (33). Donley 1 placed 10<sup>th</sup> and members are Malerie Simpson (20), Josh Dunn (35) and Hailey Wilson (39).

The Senior Division Team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and members are Brandalyn Ellis (3), Darcie Hunsaker (9) and Tanner Burch (16).

<u>Clarendon College Invitational Judging Contest</u> was held Saturday, April 1<sup>st</sup>. Junior Division Horse Judging Team placings: Donley Team 3 placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and members are Brenna Ellis (7), Laney Gates (11) and Jayde Gribble (17). Donley Team 2 placed 4<sup>th</sup> and members were Malerie Simpson (10) and Mycah Woodard (12). Donley 1 members are Maloree Wann (7), Whitney Williams (15) and Josh Dunn (13). In the Senior Division, the team of Brandalyn Ellis (4), Tanner Burch (8) and Darcie Hunsaker (10) placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall.

Junior Division Livestock Judging Team placings: Donley Team 1 placed 4<sup>th</sup> and members are Brock Hatley (8), Madison Smith (16), Koyt Tucek (17) and Jodee Pigg (25). Donley Team 2 placed 9<sup>th</sup> and members are Grayson Waldrop (20), Calder Havens (34), Grant Haynes (46) and Tyler Harper (85). Donley Team 3 placed 24<sup>th</sup> and members are Taylee Ehlert (63), Kasen Hatley (94), Parker Haynes (110) and Levi Gates (130).

#### **Dudz to Dazzle Results**

Donley County 4-H had 8 members compete in the Dudz to Dazzle Contest in which teams were given a discarded garment or textile item to redesign and repurpose into a new consumer product in a given category with a "closet" of additional materials that could be incorporated into their item. After completion, each team then presented their finished item to the panel of judges with each member having a speaking part in their presentation.

The junior team of Kennadie Cummins, Tandie Cummins, Taylee Ehlert and Whitney Williams placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the accessory category with their "jeans turned to a neck choker". The intermediate team of Laney Gates, Hailey Wilson, Jayde Gribble and Riley Jantz was given high praise for their "pillowcase transformed into an apron" but were disqualified after the judges ruled that an apron was considered an accessory and not a wearable, which was their given category.

#### Livestock Judging Results

The District 1 4-H Livestock Judging Contest was held during the Spring Roundup on April 21<sup>st</sup> at WTAMU Nance Ranch and Donley County 4-H had 14 members compete. The results for the Junior Division follow: Team 1 was 4<sup>th</sup> place and members are Grant Haynes (5), Levi Gates (11), Kennady Waldrop (35) and Taylee Ehlert (56). Team 2 placed 17<sup>th</sup> and members are Kasen Hatley(9) and Presley Smith (43). There were two Intermediate teams with Team 1 placing 7<sup>th</sup> and Team 2 placing 8<sup>th</sup>. Members of Team 1 are Brock Hatley (6), Grayson Waldrop (29), Koyt Tucek (30) and Madison Smith (58). Team 2 members are Calder Havens (13), Tyler Harper (18) and Jodee Pigg (34). Caton Grahn competed individually in the Senior Division and placed 25<sup>th</sup> overall.

#### **D1 Horse Judging Contest**

Donley 4-H members competed in the District Horse Judging Contest at WT on April 21<sup>st</sup>. They all did very well and our Senior Division girl, Brandalyn Ellis gets to advance on to State Roundup! She placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall as an individual and the Senior team placed 6<sup>th</sup> overall. Members are Brandalyn, Tanner Burch (22), Darcie Hunsaker (23) and Taylor Shaller (24). In the Intermediate and Junior Divisions several individuals placed in the top 10! In the overall team placings, the Intermediate team of Malerie Simpson (2), Josh Dunn (4), Darcy Grahn (11) and Mycah Woodard (24) won 1<sup>st</sup> place while Brenna Ellis (3), Laney Gates (7), Hailey Wilson (8) and Jayde Gribble (16) placed 2<sup>nd</sup> as a team. The Junior team of Maloree Wann (1), Bryce Williams (7), Gracie Ellis (13) and Whitney Williams (17) placed 2<sup>nd</sup>. A big thanks to coach Robin Ellis!

#### Consumer Decision Making

Four members of Donley 4-H competed in the Consumer Decision Making Contest after completing the Consumer Education Project led by Lindy Craft. This project taught members how to compare prices, test for quality and make purchases based on facts and research that will help them improve their money management and decision making skills. Our Intermediate team placed 5<sup>th</sup> in the contest and members were Izzy Craft (6), Laney Gates (16) and Hailey Wilson (20). Chardy Craft competed as an individual in the Senior Division and placed 11<sup>th</sup> overall.
